

That simple act of restoration awakened hearts around the world.

People began praying differently, worshiping differently, and most of all, listening differently.

What followed was the question every awakened heart must ask next:

“If I know His Name, how do I walk in His ways?”

This book is the answer to that question.

The Feasts of Light: Obedience Over Sacrifice is not a new system of religion; it's the natural continuation of revelation.

Once the heart knows His Name, it begins to hunger for His rhythm.

We move from singing about Him to living in His calendar – from calling to walking, from worship to obedience. It is what we are meant to do.

The Feasts are not burdens to bear; they are celebrations to remember.

They are love letters written into time – seven annual appointments and one weekly heartbeat called Sabbath.

Every one of them points back to the Creator who still keeps His promises and forward to the King who will soon keep His final one.

This journey will challenge modern assumptions, but it will also heal weary faith.

You will find that obedience is not the enemy of grace – it's the evidence of it.

He removed the burden of sin that kept us from keeping His Law, not the Law itself.

So as you begin this study, remember:

Worship restored is not complete until truth becomes practice.

To know His Name is to honor His time.

To honor His time is to walk in His light.

INTRODUCTION: WHY WE STILL KEEP HIS FEASTS

“These are My appointed times.” – Leviticus 23:2

The Invitation of Time

Before the first nation, before the first sacrifice, before even the fall of man,
Yahuah set lights in the heavens “for signs and for seasons” — moedim,
His appointments in time.

They were never ours to schedule or cancel; they were His way of saying,
“Meet Me here.”

Every Feast tells the same story from a different angle:
Deliverance, Purity, Resurrection, Covenant, Awakening, Atonement,
Dwelling — and every seventh day, Rest.

Together they form the rhythm of redemption that beats from Genesis to
Revelation.

When Yahusha came, He did not erase these appointments;
He arrived at them — on time, every time.
He was crucified on Passover, buried during Unleavened Bread,
raised as our First Fruits (on ULB), and His Spirit poured out on Shavuot.
The next blasts of the trumpet, the Day of Atonement,
and the Feast of Tabernacles still wait in prophecy for His return.

Obedience Over Sacrifice

In a world of noise and novelty, the ancient command still resounds:

“To obey is better than sacrifice.” – 1 Samuel 15:22 (cf. Prov. 21:3, 1 John 5:3)

These pages are not about ritual; they are about relationship.
The Feasts are not works that earn salvation,
but acts of remembrance that keep us aligned with the One who saves.
He removed the burden of sin that kept us from keeping the Law —
not the Law itself.
Grace does not replace obedience; it restores it.

one for each Feast plus the Sabbath and introduction.

Flexible Format:
suitable for college courses, small groups, or personal devotion.

Leaders may assign one Feast per week or
expand each to a two-week session for deeper study.

5. Yom Teruah (Trumpets)

Warning, awakening, Messiah coming



6. Yom Kipur (Atonement)

Atonement, the High Priest entering once



7. Sukkot (Tabernacles)

Kingdom dwelling, restoration & joy. New Heavenly bodies.

PAGAN: Never Found in Any Scripture



Easter / Ishtar

Passover blood → replaced with fertility/egg symbolism

Sin could be paid away — reversing the purpose of Atonement through repentance

The Same Principalities Moved the Saturday Sabbath to Sunday. The Bible did not.

Purpose: To equip believers with discernment, not condemnation.

Aren't these just harmless traditions?



APPENDIX III: THE 364-DAY CALENDAR OF CREATION

MOON ≠ BIBLE CALENDAR:

Jubilees 6:36–38

“...they will make the year begin ten days too soon...”

“...and many will follow after the moon...”

“...and they will corrupt the ordinance and go wrong...”

(cf. Enoch 74:12–17, 72:32, 74:8–9, 82:4–6)

This is clearly a rebuke of lunar reckoning.

Jubilees states that using the moon will produce error, feast displacement, and festival corruption.

Enoch 80:2–8: Speaks of future corruption of the luminaries – people will stop keeping the precise order.

Daniel (7:25, 12:7), Revelation (12:6, 12:14) and Ezekiel (4:4–6) use 360-day years in their prophetic clock. They are not counting the 4 intercalary days which practice Enoch defines. They did not follow the moon. Creation clearly begins at Daytime, not night... Elohim created Light first and named it “Day.” Evening and Morning appear next, not before.

The solar path through the six Eastern gates (1 Enoch 72).

Q: “If a biblical year has 364 days, won’t it lose a day yearly?”

A: Excellent question – but the Enochic system (used by Qumran) was self-correcting.

Each quarter of 91 days = 13 Sabbaths perfectly aligned ($364 \div 7 = 52$ exact weeks).

There was no drifting Feast since each season began on the same weekday annually.

Every 5–6 years, a 7-day reconciliation (intercalary week) realigned the seasons – not a 13th month, but a week of reset (Jubilees 6:29–38). Enoch requires a 364-day year AND seasonal accuracy; together these force intercalation – most reasonably a 7-day insertion every 5–6 years – to preserve the commanded structure.

“Man added leap years (days) – Yahuah designed leap weeks (7: Number of completion).”

The biblical calendar never breaks the Sabbath rhythm – every Feast lands on the same weekday forever, keeping divine order. One cannot break the 7-day cycle.

FOR TEACHERS AND SMALL-GROUP LEADERS

How to Lead the Rhythm of Redemption *Your Calling as a Guide*

You are not simply teaching a curriculum – you are stewarding an awakening. Each Feast you lead is an encounter between Heaven’s timing and human hearts. The goal is not perfect delivery, but presence – that your students, family, or fellowship sense Yahuah drawing near through His Word, His Name, and His appointed times.

Encourage questions, welcome wonder, and never rush the moments of silence. Truth changes minds; presence changes lives.

Core Teaching Philosophy

Principle

1. Scripture First

What It Means in Practice

Always begin with the Word before commentary or activity. Let students see the source.

2. Simplicity over Performance

You don’t have to be a scholar. Read clearly, discuss honestly, and let the Ruah (Spirit) teach.

3. Participation over Presentation

Ask, don’t just tell. Allow learners to read aloud, journal, sing, and interact with one another.

4. Revelation over Routine

If the Spirit leads discussion in a new direction, follow His flow. The Feast itself is a rehearsal of obedience.

5. Relationship over Ritual

Every activity should point back to Yahuah’s desire to dwell with His people.

SUGGESTED PACING PLAN

Standard 9-Week Format

Week	Theme	Focus

Extended 18-Week Format (optional for academic semesters)

Assign one Feast per two weeks, including deeper Q&A and student-led reflections.

Opening Each Session

Start with Silence – 30 seconds of stillness before prayer.

Pray the *Name* – Example:

“Abba Yahuah, we meet You at Your appointed time.

Write Your Word on our hearts, open our ears, and dwell among us.”

Read the Key Verse Aloud (rotate readers weekly).

Watch or Sing the Linked Song (from link or live worship).

Invite Discussion – Use “Warm-Up” and “Dig Deeper” sections freely.

Encourage leaders to close every session with a reflective question and journal time, giving learners ownership of their obedience.

Integrating Worship

Each lesson’s Worship Moment is designed as a transition, not a break.

Use these songs to move from hearing to responding.

Let worship seal the teaching – not follow it.

Suggested sequence:

Word → Reflection → Worship → Journal → Prayer

For Schools, Churches, and Home Fellowships

College or Seminary Level: Use as a Biblical Feasts and Prophetic Typology elective; include 2-page essays per Feast.

High School / Youth Groups: Emphasize the story and symbol of each Feast through interactive crafts or journal prompts.

Families: Read one section each Sabbath, aligning family rhythm with His.

Every environment becomes sacred when His timing is honored.


A Leader's Prayer

WEEK 1: OBEDIENCE IS BETTER THAN SACRIFICE



THE HEART YAHUAH DESIRES
IS ONE THAT LISTENS.

Key Verse:

‘Has Yahuah as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of Yahuah? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed than the fat of rams.’ – 1 Samuel 15:22

“True worship begins where pride ends – at obedience.”

Lesson Objectives

Distinguish obedience from mere ritual.

See how disobedience destroys covenant blessing.

Recognize obedience as the foundation for every Feast command.

Intro Reflection: (1 Sam. 15)

Saul lost a kingdom for sparing what seemed useful. We gain a Kingdom by surrendering what seems necessary. Every Feast we keep begins with a listening heart.

1 The Test of Saul – Obedience Defined

When Saul justified partial obedience – “I spared the best for sacrifice” – he replaced revelation with reasoning.

Yahuah’s standard never changes: He values the heart that listens more than the hand that offers.

Partial obedience is complete rebellion disguised as worship.

2 The Pattern of the Feasts

From Passover’s command to mark the door to Tabernacles’ call to rejoice, each Feast begins the same way – “Speak to the children of Israel and say...” (Lev 23).

The Feasts exist not for offerings, but for hearing and responding.

Yahusha kept every one – not for salvation, but for obedience.

3 The Obedience of Yahusha

He said, “I did not come to abolish the Law but to fulfill it.”
(Matt. 5:17–19)

Fulfill = *plēroō*, to fill to its fullness, not to end.

He removed the burden of sin that prevented obedience – not the instructions themselves.

“He removed the chains that kept us from the Law, not the Law that kept us from chains.”

Note: Saul was told to eliminate giant tribes and all their manipulated goods. That cannot dismiss any modern claim.

Reflection: Write one area where you obey halfway.

Q & A – Obedience

Q: Didn't Yahusha's death end the Law?

A: He ended the *curse* of sin that condemned us (*Gal 3:13*). The Law now lives inside, written by the Spirit (*Jer 31:33*). Anyone claiming the "Law of Sin and Death" is the Law of Yahuah, is not reading the Bible. Paul defines that well (*Rom. 7:8*).

Q: If we are under grace, why obey?

A: Grace empowers obedience.

Disobedience is not freedom – it's relapse. (*Rom 6:15–16*)

Q: Is obedience legalism?

A: Legalism obeys to earn love; true obedience obeys because of love. (*John 14:15*)

Worship Moment:

Song Link: "I Give It To You"

– thegodculture.org.

As the music plays, whisper this prayer:

"Teach me to listen before I serve."

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: What's one instruction from Yahuah that's easy to hear but hard to do?

Dig Deeper

Read 1 Sam 15:13-23. Why did Saul's reasoning sound religious?

Compare Matt 7:21–23 and John 14:15 – what separates obedience from performance?

How does grace make obedience possible rather than optional?

Apply It: Choose one command or conviction you'll act on within 7 days – write it in the journal space.

Prayer Focus:

"Abba Yahuah, deliver me from half-hearted obedience. Help me love Your voice more than my plan."

Memory Verse Recap:

Hand-write 1 Sam 15:22 on the lines to the right. Commit it to memory this week.

"Obedience is the seed from which every Feast blooms."

Personal Journal: My Altar of Obedience

What specific act of obedience will I offer to Yahuah this week?

“He removed the burden of sin that kept us from keeping the Law – not the Law itself.”

WEEK 2: WHY WE STILL KEEP HIS FEASTS HIS APPOINTMENTS STILL STAND.

Key Verse:

‘Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, Concerning the feasts of the LORD (YHWH), which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, even these are my feasts.’ – Leviticus 23:2

*“The Feasts were not man’s tradition to end,
but Yahuah’s appointments to remember.”*

Lesson Objectives:

Explain how the Feasts belong to Yahuah Himself.

Identify the difference between fulfillment and abolition.

Recognize that prophetic cycles continue until His return.

Intro Reflection:

Humanity keeps birthdays and anniversaries as reminders of what matters.

Yahuah wrote His own calendar of remembrance – not for ritual’s sake, but for relationship.

1 The Author of the Feasts

The Feasts are not “Jewish holidays.” They belong to the One who said, “These are My Feasts.”

Every prophet, patriarch, and Yahusha Himself kept them because they mark the timeline of redemption – creation to new creation.

To understand prophecy, you must walk Yahuah’s calendar.

2 Fulfilled Does Not Mean Finished

When Yahusha said He came to fulfill the Law, He used the Greek plēroō – “to fill to completion,” not “to abolish.”

A cup filled to the brim is not discarded; it is complete and ready to be shared.

Each Feast finds its fullest meaning in Him, yet the invitation to celebrate remains.

“To fulfill is to illuminate, not eliminate.”

3 The Shadow and the Substance

Paul wrote: “These are a shadow of things to come, but the body is of Messiah.” (Col 2:16–17, cf. Heb 10:1)

A shadow proves light exists. We don’t destroy the shadow because the light appeared – we walk in it toward its source.

The Feasts remain the pattern of heavenly realities (Heb 8:5; Rev 21:23). The shadow does not disappear until the source is removed. Heaven is still there.

Q & A – Fulfilled ≠ Abolished

Q: If Yahusha fulfilled the Feasts, aren't they over?

A: Fulfillment is continuation in perfection, not termination. You don't cancel graduation because you finished (fulfilled) school; you celebrate it every year.

Q: Did Paul tell Gentiles to ignore the Feasts?

A: He told them not to let Pharisees judge how they keep them (*Col 2:16-17*). He assumed they, including Gentiles, did keep them calling them shadows of things to come. Shadows of the future do not pass away.

Q: Are Feasts only for Israel?

A: Through Messiah, we are grafted into Israel (*Rom 11:17-24*). His covenant family shares His appointments. Gentiles were always included in the Covenant (Ex 12:49; Num 15:29; Lev 24:22). Israel was defined by Covenant, not blood.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: "Restore the Foundations" – thegodculture.org.

As you listen, thank Yahuah for inviting you to His calendar, not man's.

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: What's one tradition you keep every year? What does it teach you about your values?

Dig Deeper

Read Matt 5:17-19. What did Yahusha actually say He would do with the Law? When does Heaven pass? (*1Pet. 3*)

Compare Col 2:16-17 with Heb 10:1. What is the difference between shadow and reality?

Why is continuing to keep the Feasts a testimony of faith, not legalism?

Apply It: Mark one upcoming Feast you will observe intentionally this year. Plan how you will prepare.

Prayer Focus:

"Abba, thank You for Your appointments. Write Your times on my heart so I never miss Your visits."

Memory Verse Recap:

'These are My Feasts.'
— Leviticus 23:2

WEEK 3: SPRING FEAST - PASSOVER & UNLEAVENED BREAD

THE CALL TO PURITY

Key Verse:

‘Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us: Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness; but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.’

– 1 Corinthians 5:7–8

Leave Egypt. Live in Truth. *“You cannot celebrate deliverance while still loving what enslaved you.”*

Lesson Objectives:

Understand how Passover and Unleavened Bread reveal Yahusha's death and our cleansing.

Recognize that “fulfilled” means “embodied,” not “abolished.”

Experience personal purification through obedience.

Intro Reflection:

The Cross was not random; it was timed – the Lamb was slain and His body risen during Unleavened Bread matching Isaac's sacrifice. (Jub 17)

Forgetting the Feasts is forgetting the calendar of our salvation.

1 The Pattern of Deliverance

Passover marked the night Yahuah distinguished His people by the blood (including Gentiles).

Every home that obeyed was protected – not because of their works nor bloodline, but because they followed His instruction.

Unleavened Bread followed immediately – they left Egypt in haste, taking no time for the leaven to rise.

Obedience was their doorpost; faith was their exit.

2 The Cross Inside the Feast

Yahusha was arrested and executed on Passover/Unleavened Bread. He became the Lamb whose blood covers the door of our hearts replacing all animal sacrifices. (Heb 10)

He rested in the tomb on Unleavened Bread – the very Feast that commands the removal of sin (leaven).

The Cross is not outside the Feasts – it sits in the center of them.

“The world remembers the Cross, but forgets the Feasts that reveal its meaning.”

3 The Meaning of Leaven

Leaven represents sin, decay, and corruption spreading quietly through the dough.

Removing leaven was never about diet – it was a visible lesson in purity. Yahusha said, “Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees.” (Matt 16:6)

Every spring, Yahuah invites His people to sweep their houses and hearts clean. Why stop?

4 The Passover of the Heart

Salvation was never earned through slaughtered animals – it was purchased by Messiah whom we obey. When we obey His appointed time, we walk in the same obedience that protected Israel.

The Cross was the door; Passover was the frame.

Q & A – Remembering the Cross Within the Feasts

Q: If the Cross fulfilled Passover, why keep it?

A: The Cross did not replace Passover – it perfected it. We celebrate the Lamb by keeping His appointed day of deliverance, not another day.

Q: “Is keeping the Feast a denial of grace?”

A: No – it’s a celebration of grace. Grace cleanses so we **can** obey.

Q: Does leaven still matter?

A: It teaches that sin spreads silently. Physical cleaning reflects spiritual truth – the heart and house both belong to Yahuah.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: “Anthem of Freedom - Passover” or “The Song of Moses.”

As you listen, close your eyes and thank the Lamb who removed your leaven.

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: What do you think it means to “keep the Feast with sincerity and truth”?

Dig Deeper

Read Exodus 12:1–14 and 1 Cor 5:7–8. What links do you see between them? How does removing leaven symbolize personal repentance?

Why is remembering the Feasts essential to remembering the Cross correctly?

Apply It: Do a “House Sweep Challenge.” Clean a space while confessing anything Yahuah is asking you to remove from your life.

Prayer Focus:

“Abba, thank You for the Lamb. Help me remove the leaven of sin and celebrate Your deliverance in truth.”

Memory Verse Recap:

‘Therefore let us keep the Feast ... with unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.’ – 1 Cor. 5:8

Note: *The Gospels define the Lord's Supper or Communion was a Passover event at the end of the Passover meal. We especially do this during Passover.*

WEEK 4: SPRING FEAST – FIRST FRUITS

Key Verse:

But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits
of them that slept. – 1 Corinthians 15:20

THE SHEAF LIFTED
— THE SON RISEN —

THE DAY OF NEW LIFE

“If He rose as the First Fruits, then every obedient life becomes His harvest.”

Lesson Objectives:

Grasp how First Fruits marks the resurrection. Not the specific day, but the concept very close in timing.

See how Paul used Feast language to explain new life.

Recognize that resurrection is the reward of obedience.

Intro Reflection:

On the next Sabbath morning after the last Sabbath of Unleavened Bread, Israel lifted the first sheaf of harvest to Yahuah.

Very close in timing, Yahusha walked out of the tomb — the first sheaf of a greater harvest to come. It remains.

1 The Ancient Offering

Each spring, the priest waved the earliest barley sheaf before Yahuah, dedicating the entire harvest that would follow.

Only after the first offering was accepted could the rest be gathered.

“Until the first sheaf was lifted, the field remained forbidden.”

So too, the resurrection of Yahusha sanctified every future resurrection.

2 The Morning of Resurrection

Women came to the tomb while it was still dark — and found it empty just after sunrise when Sabbath ended.

Just as the priest lifted the first sheaf in the Temple, the Son was lifted from the grave.

He wasn’t breaking from the Law; He was fulfilling (keeping) it to the week.

The sheaf and the Savior rose together.

3 The Harvest of Hearts

Paul drew on this Feast to explain our hope:

“Each in his own order: Messiah the First Fruits, then those who are His at His coming.” — 1 Cor 15:23

First Fruits is our guarantee.

His resurrection was the down-payment that ours is sure.

Though this day is an offering in which we gather together, it is not a Sabbath. However, let no one demean its importance.

Forget the Feast, and you lose the timeline of eternity. Yahusha did not abolish this calendar, He embedded Himself within even calling Himself Lord of the Sabbath.

Q & A – Why the Resurrection Needs the Feast

Q: If we already celebrate Easter, why First Fruits?

A: Easter was a later pagan spring festival based on Ishtar's fertility rituals (bunnies and eggs); First Fruits is the biblical concept of Yahusha's rising. The power is in His timing, not man's tradition.

Q: Does celebrating First Fruits add to the Gospel?

A: No – it reveals the Gospel's precision and was there first. The 1 passage that inserts "Easter" in English commits fraud as the word is Passover (pesach- 29 times in NT). Yahusha rose **on the day foretold**.

Q: What does it mean that He is our First Fruits?

A: He is the first of a new creation; by His obedience we follow in His order, the coming harvest of resurrected saints.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: "Firstfruits Rising."

While the music plays, lift your hands as Israel lifted the sheaf – dedicating your life's harvest to Him.

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: What do you most look forward to in the "resurrection harvest"?

Dig Deeper

Read Leviticus 23:9–14. How did the offering foreshadow Yahusha?

Compare John 20:1–18 with the Feast timing – what do you notice?

Why does Paul tie our future hope to a past Feast?

Apply It: Write a short note of thanksgiving for something Yahuah has resurrected in your life – faith, hope, or calling – and read it aloud this week.

Prayer Focus:

"Thank You, Abba, that the grave could not hold Your First Fruit. Let my life be part of Your harvest."

Memory Verse Recap:

'Messiah has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.' – 1 Cor 15:20

WEEK 5: SUMMER FEAST - SHAVUOT / PENTECOST

THE FIRE AND THE WORD

Key Verse:

But this shall be the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel; After those days, saith the LORD (YHWH), I will put my law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts; and will be their God, and they shall be my people.
— Jeremiah 31:33 (Acts 2:1-4)

“At Sinai He wrote on stone – in Jerusalem He wrote on hearts.”

Lesson Objectives:

Trace the connection between Sinai and Pentecost (Greek for Shavuot).

Understand how the Spirit and the Word complete each other.

Experience renewed covenant through obedience and power.

Intro Reflection:

Fifty days after the Exodus, Israel stood at Sinai and heard His voice from fire.

Fifty days after the Resurrection, the disciples stood in Jerusalem and heard His Spirit in fire.

The same mountain moved from stone to soul. These are connected.

1 From Sinai to Hearts

The Feast of Weeks (Shavuot) was a harvest festival and the Day of Covenant Renewal at Sinai. Noah renewed covenant on this same day as did Abraham.

Lightning and thunder marked His presence then; tongues of fire did the same in Acts 2.

The covenant did not change – the location did: from stone tablets to human hearts.

Obedience without Spirit is rigid; Spirit without Word is rootless.

2 The Birth of the Body

At Sinai, a nation was born in covenant. On Shavuot, Isaac, son of covenant, was also born. Yahusha was born this same day following the same prophetic pattern just as Luke 1:26 directly defines.

At Pentecost, the Body of Messiah was born in power as the Ruah came.

Three thousand died for idolatry at Sinai (Ex 32:28); three thousand were saved by truth in Acts 2:41.

The Feast did not end – it flipped from judgment to grace.

3 The Law and the Spirit

Yahusha did not erase the commandments (Matt 5:17-20) just as He said He would not; He engraved them deeper, even His birthday.

Celebrating Shavuot (Pentecost) brings remembrance of His birth and the coming of the Ruah Ha Hodesh (Holy Spirit).

The Spirit enables what stone required but flesh could not.

“The Law was the blueprint; the Spirit is the builder.”

Q & A – Word and Spirit, Not One Without the Other

Q: Did Pentecost replace the Law?

A: No – it fulfilled its promise (Jer. 31:33). The same Law moved from stone to heart.

Q: If I have the Spirit, do I still need instruction?

A: The Spirit is the Teacher of the Word, not its substitute (John 14:26).

Q: Was Pentecost the Church's 'birthday'?

A: It was the renewal of Israel's covenant through the Spirit – the body of believers became the living Temple. It was Isaac's birth and Yahusha's birth. We don't file it away.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: “Happy Birthday Yahusha,” or “Breath of Shavuot”

Lift your hands as the disciples did – not to receive power for show, but for obedience in love.

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: When have you felt Yahuah write something on your heart?

Dig Deeper

Read Ex 19:16–20 and Acts 2:1–4. What similarities do you see?

How does the Spirit help us keep the commandments today?

Why does obedience without relationship still fail?

Apply It: Write one area where you need the Spirit's fire to ignite your obedience.

Prayer Focus:

“Write Your words on our hearts, Yahuah. Let Your Spirit make us faithful to Your covenant.”

Memory Verse Recap:

‘I will write My law in their hearts.’ – Jer 31:33

THE KING IS COMING

WEEK 6: FALL FEAST – TRUMPETS (YOM TERUAH)

Key Verse:

For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. – 1 Thessalonians 4:16–17

Blow ye the trumpet in Zion, and sound an alarm in my holy mountain: let all the inhabitants of the land tremble: for the day of the LORD (YHWH) cometh, for it is nigh at hand; – Joel 2:1

“Every blast of the shofar is a wake-up call from Heaven – the King is on His way.”

Lesson Objectives:

Understand Trumpets as a prophetic announcement of the King’s return.

See how its themes of awakening and repentance prepare for Atonement.

Hear the call to readiness – spiritual alertness in an age of distraction.

Intro Reflection:

In ancient Israel, no Feast day began without a sound. Trumpets broke the silence of summer and announced the approach of judgment and joy.

Today it still calls us to wake from spiritual sleep and prepare for the coming King.

1 The Trumpet of Awakening

Yahuah told Moses to keep a day of blowing (Teruah) as a memorial (Lev 23:24). This was forecasting a future event, not one of the past.

No explanation was given – only sound. Because sometimes He speaks in tones before He speaks in words.

The Feast of Trumpets is the alarm clock of the soul.

2 The Prophetic Signal

Paul linked the shofar to the resurrection: “At the last trumpet ... the dead will be raised incorruptible.” (1 Cor 15:52)

This Feast remains unfulfilled – its final blast will announce Yahusha’s return. It cannot pass away before it was ever fulfilled.

The sound that shook Sinai will shake earth once more.

The first trumpet summoned Israel to a mountain; the last will summon the world to the King.

3 A Call to Repentance

Before Atonement comes Trumpets – because judgment is not meant to condemn but to correct. This is required especially of His ekklesia.

The ten days between Trumpets and Atonement (Yamim Nora’im) are a time of heart searching.

We do not fear the sound – we answer it.

Repentance is the echo that proves we heard the trumpet.

Q & A – When Will the Trumpet Sound?

Q: Didn't Trumpets end at the Cross?

A: The Cross fulfilled the Spring Feasts. Trumpets belongs to the Fall – the prophetic future still to come.

Q: Can we know the day of His return?

A: No one knows the day or hour (**Matt 24:36**), but we know the season and the signs. Feast language helps us recognize them.

Q: What does the shofar symbolize?"

A: A crown, a voice, and a summons. It calls nations to gather and hearts to bow.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: “Trumpets of Awakening,” or “The King Is Coming.”

As the shofar sounds, bow your head and whisper:

“Awaken me, King of Glory.”

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: What does it mean to you to “hear His trumpet” today?

Dig Deeper

Read Lev 23:23–25 and 1 Thess 4:16–18. How do they connect?

Why does Yahuah use sound to prepare His people?

How can you live “trumpet-ready” in your daily life?

Apply It: Take five minutes of silence this week. Then play a shofar recording or simple note and ask Yahuah what He is calling you to do.

Prayer Focus:

“Sound Your trumpet in my heart, Abba Yahuah. Let me be found awake and ready when You come.”

Memory Verse Recap:

‘For the trump of Elohim shall sound and the dead in Messiah shall rise.’ — 1 Thess 4:16

WEEK 7: FALL FEAST – THE DAY OF ATONEMENT (YOM KIPUR)

[Yes, only 1 “P” in Hebrew]

Key Verse:

For on that day shall the priest make an atonement for you, to cleanse you, that ye may be clean from all your sins before the LORD (YHWH).
— Leviticus 16:30

But Christ being come an high priest of good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this building; Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us. — Hebrews 9:11–12



THE DAY OF RECKONING

MERCY WALKS

WHERE NONE COULD STAND

“Before the King reigns, He first removes every record of guilt.”

Lesson Objectives:

Understand Atonement as both fulfilled and still anticipated.

Recognize Yahusha as our High Priest who entered the true Holy of Holies.

Experience personal repentance and cleansing.

Intro Reflection:

Once each year Israel waited in silence as the high priest disappeared behind the veil.

The people held their breath; one life entered to secure all lives.

That day foretold a greater High Priest — Yahusha — whose sacrifice cleanses not just a nation but creation. His work did not end at the cross, but on the coming Day of Judgment.

1 The High Priest and the Goats

Two goats were chosen — one for Yahuah’s altar, one for Azazel (the wilderness scapegoat).

The first was sacrificed to satisfy justice; the second carried sin away into desolation.

Together they pictured what Yahusha alone would do: die for our sins and remove them forever.

Mercy is not the absence of judgment – it is judgment paid in full.

2 The Veil and the Blood

When He died, the veil tore from top to bottom (Matt 27:51).

The way into the Most Holy was opened not by a priest in linen but by the Lamb in scarlet.

Atonement is now personal — the door no man could enter is forever open. However, this day is not to be discarded and forgotten in any passage.

He did not bring blood to cover sin year after year – He brought His own to end it once for all. This is realized on the Day of Judgment as His work continues.

3 The Prophetic Future

Though the sacrifice is complete, the judgment is not yet concluded.

Revelation still speaks of books opened and accounts settled (Rev 20:12).

This Feast awaits its final fulfillment when the King returns to cleanse the earth itself. Therefore, it cannot pass away before it is finally realized in full.

The blood speaks mercy today – it will speak justice tomorrow.

Q & A – The Atonement Fulfilled and Awaited

Q: Didn't Yahusha's death end Atonement?"

A: He fulfilled its sacrifice but not its judgment. He still intercedes until the books close (**Heb 7:25**).

Q: Why fast or repent if we're forgiven?"

A: Repentance keeps our hearts aligned with His mercy and reminds us the story is not finished.

Q: Will Atonement happen again?"

A: Its power never expires; its final application will cleanse the world at His return (**Rev 19:2**).

Worship Moment:

Song Link: "Cry of Atonement," or "I Give It to You."

As you listen, confess silently, then thank Him that the veil is gone.

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: What does atonement mean to you personally — guilt removed or relationship restored?

Dig Deeper

Read Lev 16:1–34 and Heb 9:11–15. How do they connect?

Why did Yahusha need to enter Heaven itself with His own blood?

How does knowing He still intercedes change the way you repent?

Apply It: Spend one hour this week in quiet reflection or fasting. Ask Yahuah to reveal any unconfessed sin and to write mercy across it.

Prayer Focus:

"High Priest of Heaven, wash me clean again. Let my life testify that Your blood still speaks."

Memory Verse Recap:

'By His own blood He entered once for all the Holy Place, having obtained eternal redemption.' — Heb 9:12

WEEK 8: FALL FEAST – TABERNACLES (SUKKOT)

Key Verses:

And it shall come to pass, that every one that is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall even go up from year to year to worship the King, the LORD (Yahuah) of hosts, and to keep the feast of tabernacles.

– Zechariah 14:16

And I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God. – Revelation 21:3

THE DAY OF REJOICING

“Every Feast led here – to joy, to presence, to home.”

Lesson Objectives

Understand Tabernacles as the prophetic picture of eternity.

Rejoice in the presence of Yahuah dwelling among His people.

Celebrate the completion of obedience and the joy of redemption.

Intro Reflection:

For seven days Israel built booths from palm branches and lived beneath the stars.

It was a week of laughter, harvest, and remembrance – a picture of dwelling with Yahuah forever.

It is the Feast of Joy, the wedding celebration of the ages.

1 The Joy of Dwelling

Tabernacles commemorated Israel's journey through the wilderness, when Yahuah's presence moved among them in a cloud by day and fire by night. It is also when Abraham entered the land of Canaan which Yahuah would give to him.

The booths reminded them that life is temporary – but His dwelling is eternal.

*He once walked with man in Eden.
He will do so again.*

2 The Prophetic Fulfillment

John saw the same vision Zechariah promised – a day when all nations will keep this Feast and the New Jerusalem will descend. We will also receive our new Heavenly bodies on this very day in concept. That has not happened. Thus, no man can abolish nor move this Feast.

It is not a metaphor; it is the finale of prophecy.

The King who tabernacled in flesh (John 1:14) will tabernacle again among His redeemed.

From the Garden to the Wilderness to the City – the story ends where it began: in His presence.

3 The Eighth Great Day

The seventh day closes the Feast, but the Eighth Day (Shemini Atzeret) is a separate celebration – a day of eternal rest and unending joy.

It represents the new beginning beyond time itself.

Seven days mark creation; the eighth marks new creation.

Q & A – Why Tabernacles Is Still Ahead

Q: If Yahusha already came, isn't His presence fulfilled?

A: His Spirit dwells in us now; His physical dwelling will be restored when He reigns on earth. He still has His physical body in Heaven working to build a place for us for this day.

Q: Why will all nations keep this Feast in Zechariah's prophecy?

A: Because it's the celebration of His reign – the wedding supper of the Lamb. This has not happened yet and this how we keep our memory of events to come.

Q: What is the Eighth Day about?

A: It's eternity – the unending Sabbath where Yahuah lives among His people forever.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: “Feast of Joy.”

Wave palm branches, dance, and shout: “The King is here, and He will never leave again!”

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: If Yahuah invited you to camp with Him for a week, how would you prepare?

Dig Deeper

Read Lev 23:33–43 and Zech 14:16–19. What stands out about this Feast? Compare John 1:14 and Rev 21:3 – what does it mean that He “tabernacles” with us twice?

Why is joy itself an act of obedience?

Apply It: Build a small booth, tent, or blanket fort this week. Spend time there in prayer and thanksgiving with your family, remembering His promise to dwell with you forever.

Prayer Focus:

“Abba Yahuah, thank You for every Feast that brought us to this one. May Your presence fill my life as surely as it will fill the world.”

Memory Verse Recap:

‘Behold, the Tabernacle of Elohim is with men, and He will dwell with them.’ – Rev 21:3

WEEK 9: **THE WEEKLY SABBATH**

SHABBAT SHALOM THE RHYTHM OF REST

Key Verses:

And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made.

— Genesis 2:2–3

“For the Son of man is Lord even of the sabbath day.” — Matthew 12:8

“He rested – not because He was tired, but to teach us trust.”

Lesson Objectives:

Understand the Sabbath as Yahuah's perpetual covenant sign.

See how Yahusha affirmed and magnified the Sabbath.

Restore the rhythm of rest as worship, not restriction.

Intro Reflection:

The Sabbath was the first Feast – established before sin, sacrifice, or nation.

It is not about stopping life but about returning to the Source of life.

Each Sabbath is a miniature Tabernacles, a weekly dwelling with the King.

1 The First Rest

Before the Law, before Moses, there was the seventh day. Moses wrote that too, though many forget.

Creation itself began with six days of forming and one day of communion.

The Sabbath is not a Hebrew custom; it is humanity's inheritance. There were no Hebrews before the Flood.

The first full day Adam lived was a day of rest with his Creator.

2 The Sabbath and the Savior

Yahusha healed, taught, and restored on the Sabbath – showing it was made for man's joy, not his burden (Mark 2:27). Healing is mercy, not work, never breaking the Sabbath. Moses was clear every Sabbath is for such worship and miracles. Pharisee accusations Yahusha overcame are not Bible doctrine and should never be taught that way.

He declared Himself “Lord of the Sabbath,” not its abolisher. This was a year or so before His death and resurrection. His words are never expressed in vain.

To call Him Lord is to honor what He sanctified.

He did not remove the Sabbath – He removed the guilt that kept us from enjoying it. (Matt 5:17-20)

3 The Eternal Sabbath

Hebrews 4 speaks of a “Sabbath rest remaining for the people of Elohim.”

Each seventh day is rehearsal for that eternal rest – the Eighth Day of forever. It cannot pass away.

Those who enter His rest now are training for eternity.

Rest is not laziness – it's loyalty.

Q & A – Why the Sabbath Still Matters

Q: Didn't Paul say we don't have to keep days?"

A: Paul warned against man-made traditions, not Yahuah's appointed day (Col 2:16–17). He taught it.

Q: Isn't Sunday the Christian Sabbath?"

A: No Scripture changes the seventh day. The shift came through Rome, not Revelation. One can meet any day of the week, but the Sabbath remains.

Q: Does keeping Sabbath mean legalism?"

A: Legalism seeks merit; obedience seeks fellowship. The Sabbath is relationship, not regulation.

Worship Moment:

Song Link: "The Rhythm of Rest - Sabbath."

Light a candle, breathe, and whisper:
"You are Lord of my rest."

Group Discussion & Reflection

Warm-Up: When do you feel closest to Yahuah – in work or in rest?

Dig Deeper

Read Gen 2:1–3 and Heb 4:1–11. How do they connect?

Why does true rest require obedience?

How does rest become a testimony to the world?

Apply It: Plan a Sabbath this week – turn off devices other than for use in worship and learning, sing, and thank Him for the gift of peace.

Prayer Focus:

"Creator of Heaven and Earth, thank You for inviting me to rest with You. Teach me to stop so I may see Your goodness."

Memory Verse Recap:

'The Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath day.' – Matt 12:8

For many generations, the Feasts of Yahuah have been misunderstood, mislabeled, or neglected — not from rebellion, but from inheritance. Most churches today follow a structure passed down through tradition, shaped heavily by post-biblical doctrine. Many pastors have inherited calendars and celebrations shaped during the Catholic era, long after the Apostles had passed.

But Scripture is calling the Church back — not into Judaism, not into legalism, not into bondage — but into Yahuah's appointed times, the rhythms He established for His people from the beginning.

This is not about religion.

This is about relationship — a relationship marked by obedience, remembrance, and worship.

Understanding “Fulfilled” — Not Abolished

Much confusion comes from the English word “fulfill.”

In Hebrew and Greek, fulfill means:

- ✓ to complete fully
- ✓ to establish
- ✓ to bring to its fullest meaning

Not to erase, abolish, or discontinue.

Yahusha Himself said:

“I did not come to destroy the Law or the Prophets...

Until heaven and earth pass, not the smallest letter shall pass from the Law.”
(Matt. 5:17–18)

He fulfilled Passover —
but He did not erase it.
He fulfilled Unleavened Bread —
but He did not abolish it.

He fulfilled First Fruits –
and He is still our First Fruits today.

We don't take His crucifixion, resurrection, and covenant work, file it away, and forget it. If anything, these events are the very foundation for why the Feasts remain meaningful today.

Paul Kept and Taught the Feasts – After the Resurrection

This is one of the most overlooked truths in modern Christianity.

Paul – the Apostle of Grace – not only kept the Feasts,
he taught Gentile believers to keep them.

Paul writes:

“Let us KEEP the Feast”
(1 Corinthians 5:7–8)

Not spiritually.
Not metaphorically.
Keep – meaning observe, practice, honor.

Paul hurried to reach Jerusalem for Shavuot/Pentecost (Acts 20:16).
He remained in place during Unleavened Bread (Acts 20:6).
He recognized the timing of Atonement (Acts 27:9).

Paul – writing decades after Yahusha ascended –
still honored the same biblical calendar the Apostles kept.

If the Feasts were “done away with,” Paul never got the memo.

Why Restore the Feasts Today?

Because they were never removed by Yahuah.
They were removed by men.
Because Yahusha is the center of every Feast.
Not Rabbinic tradition.
Not Judaism.
Yahusha Himself.

Because the Protestant movement never intended to throw out biblical worship –
only man-made additions.

Yet over time, much was lost, and Catholic substitutes were absorbed unconsciously:

- ✗ Easter replacing Passover
- ✗ Christmas replacing the true timeline of Yahusha's birth




