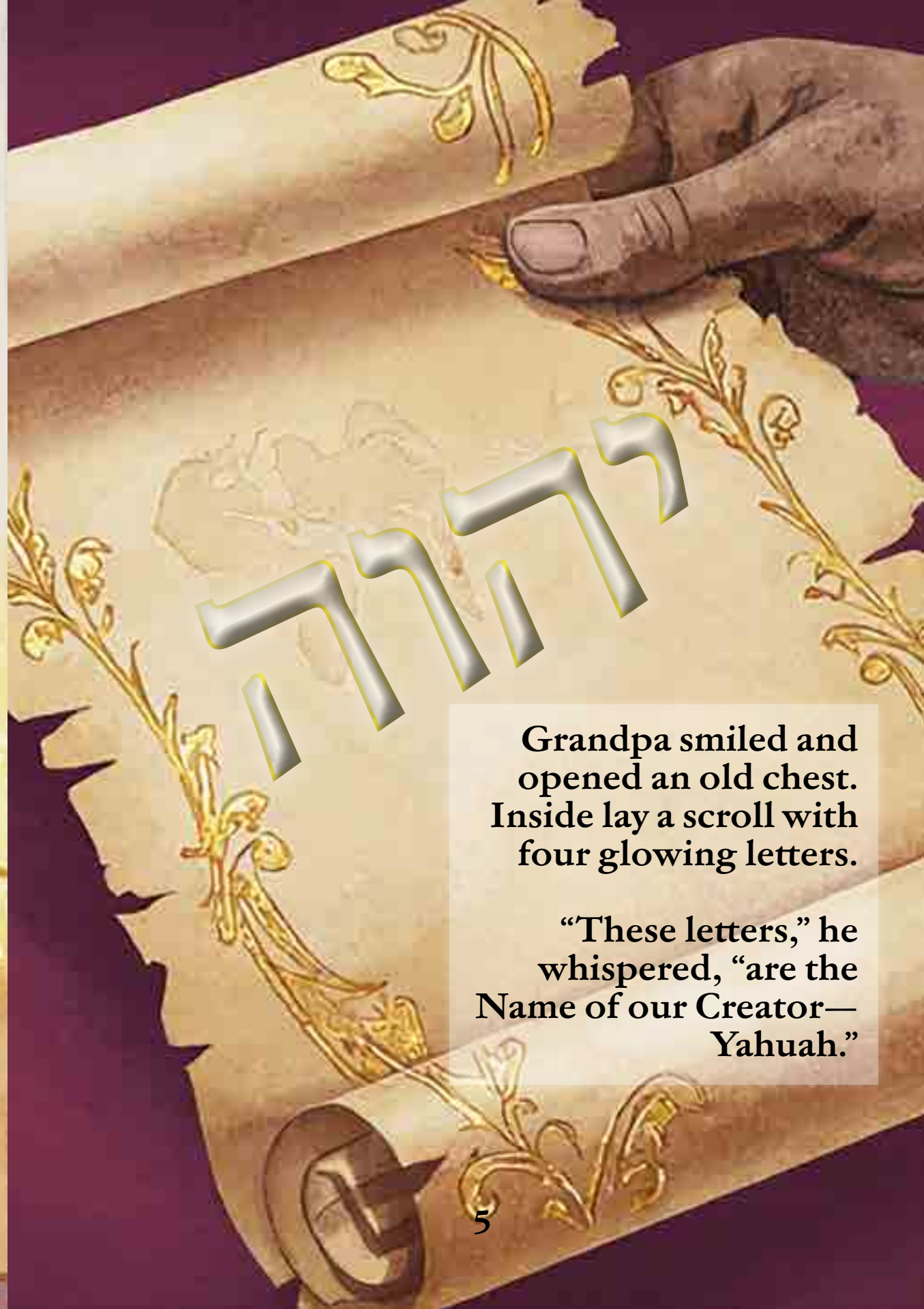

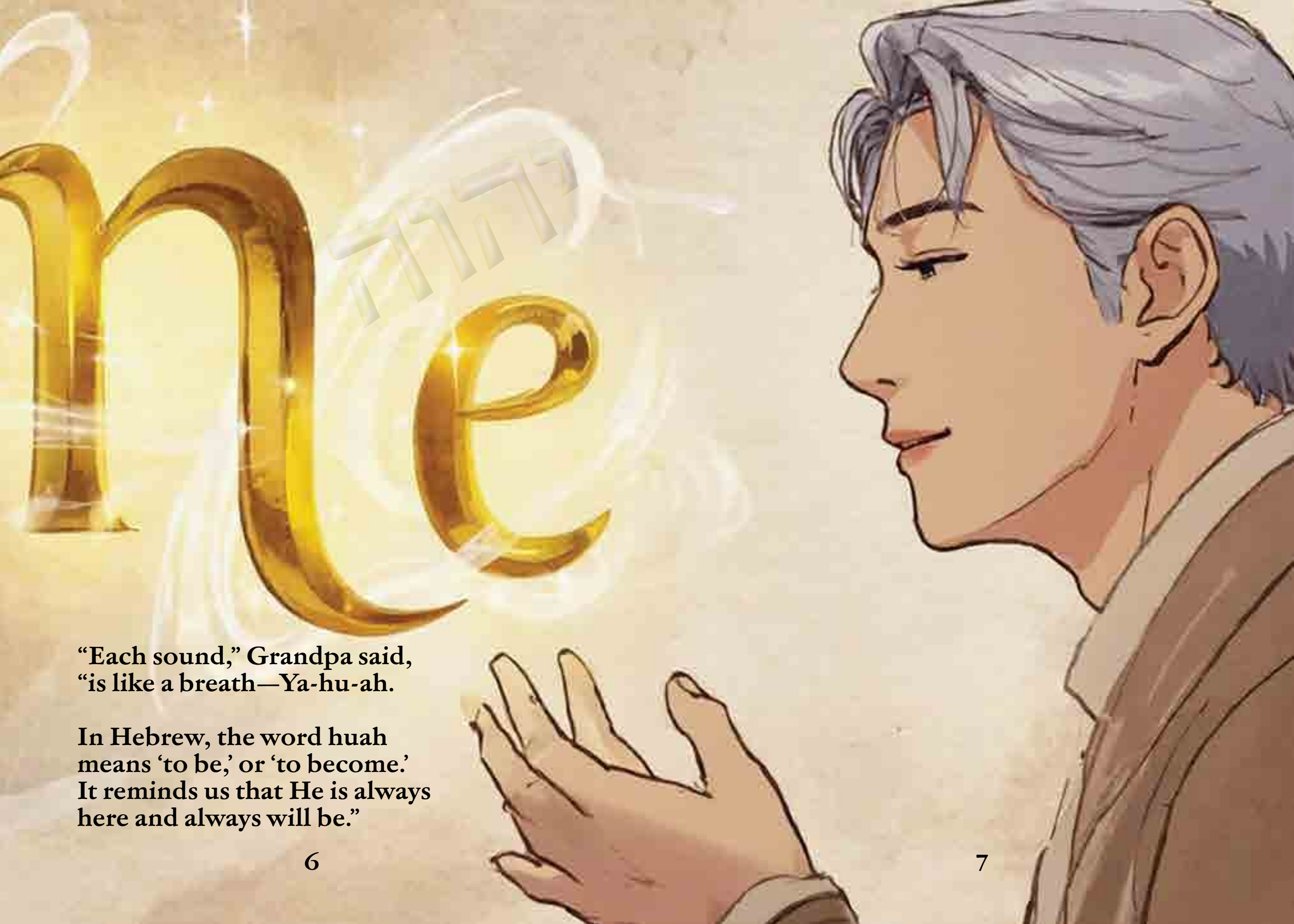
Eliora loved listening to her grandfather's prayers. He always began, "O Creator of all things..."

Long ago, people forgot the Name.

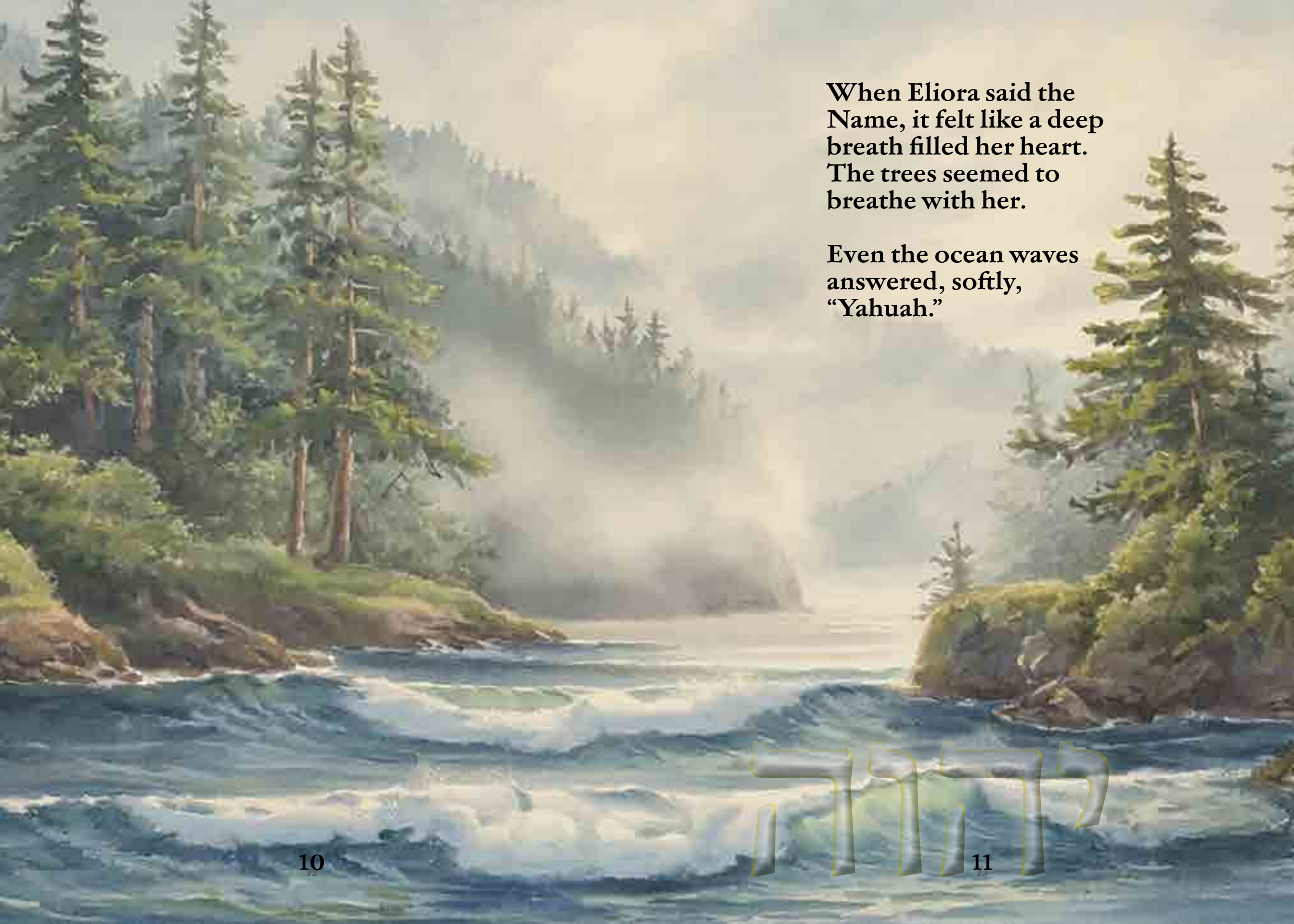
Some were afraid to say it. Others

He is.”

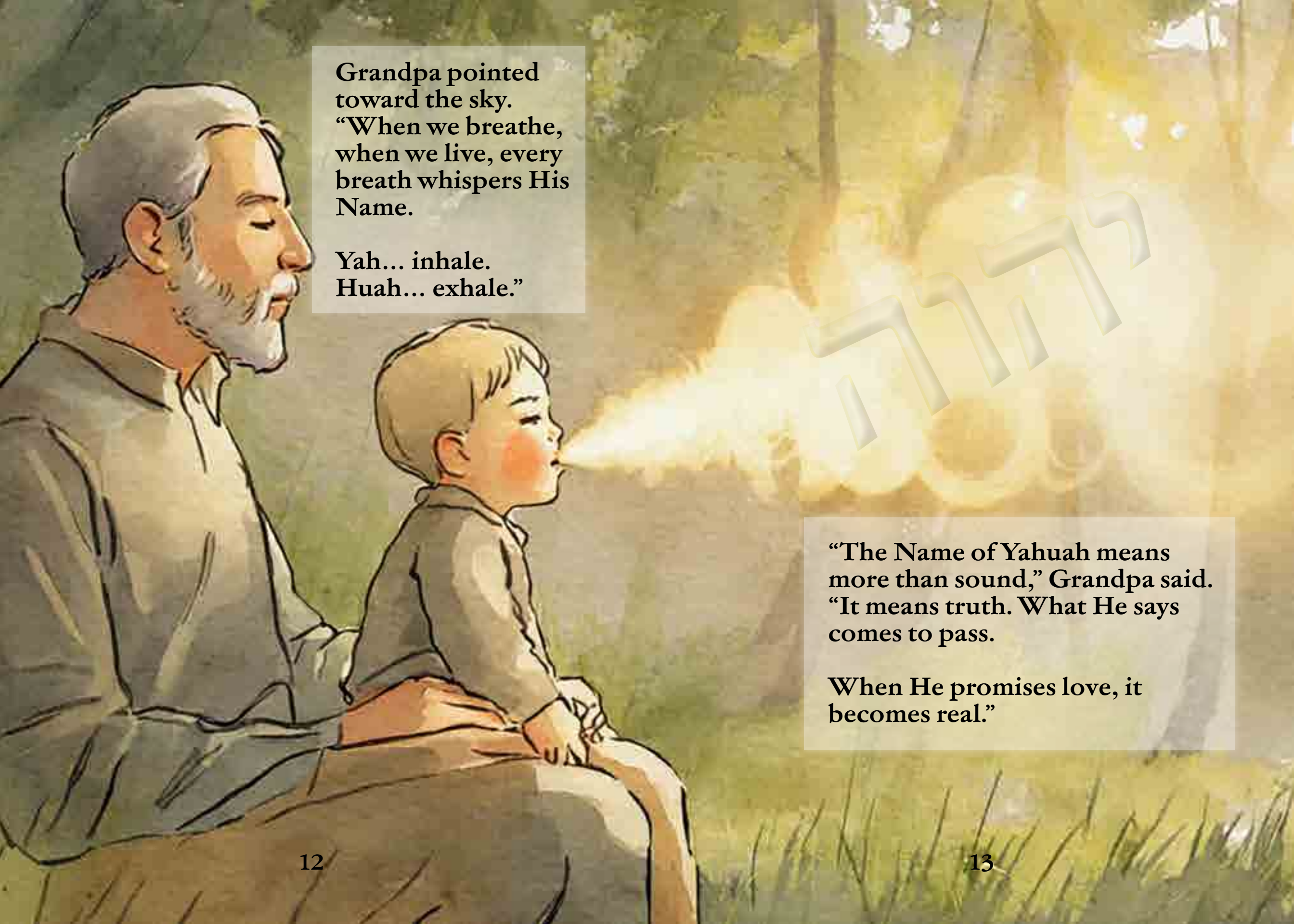
Eliora looked at the letters and

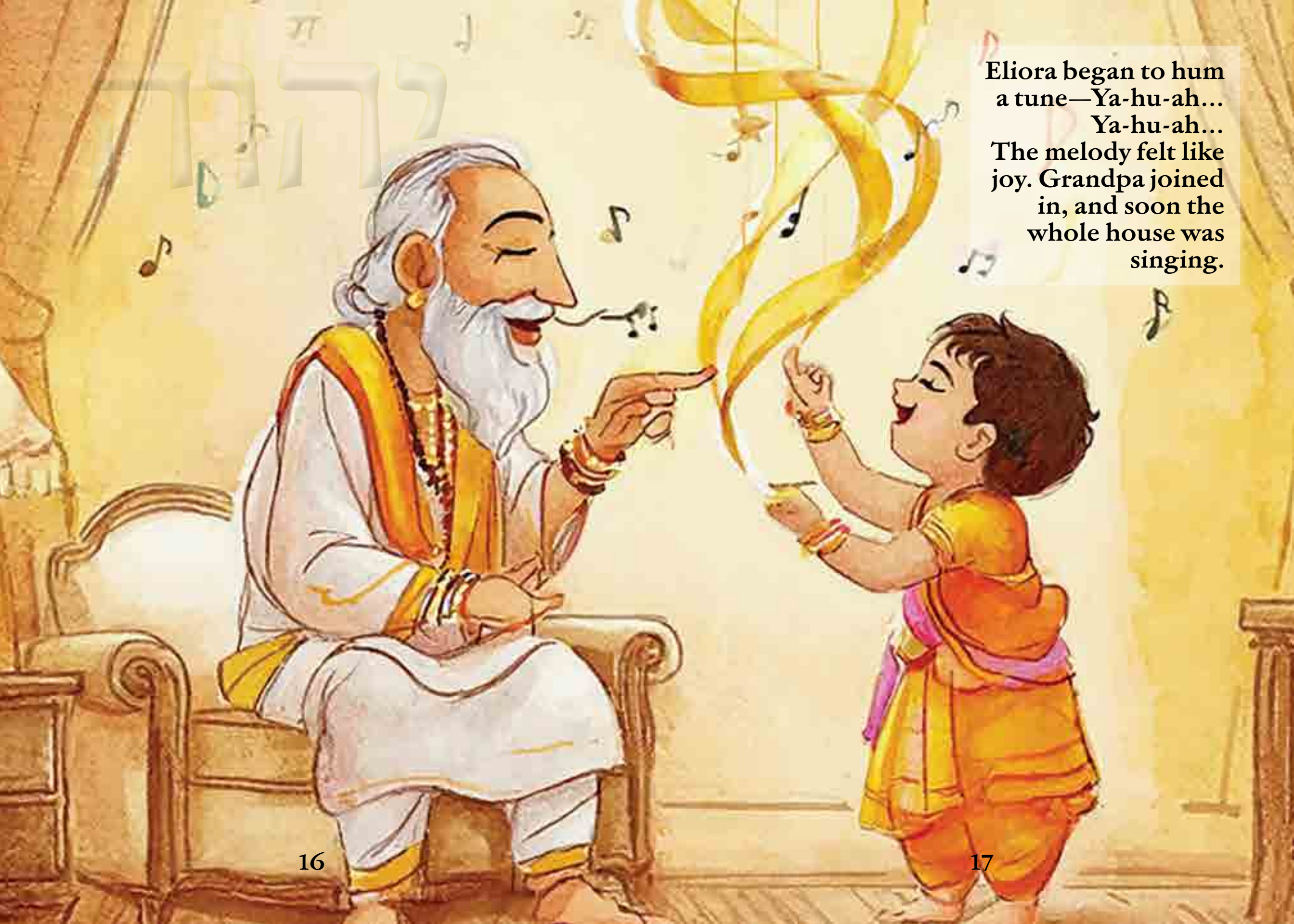


Eliora asked, “Does Yahuah love me too?”

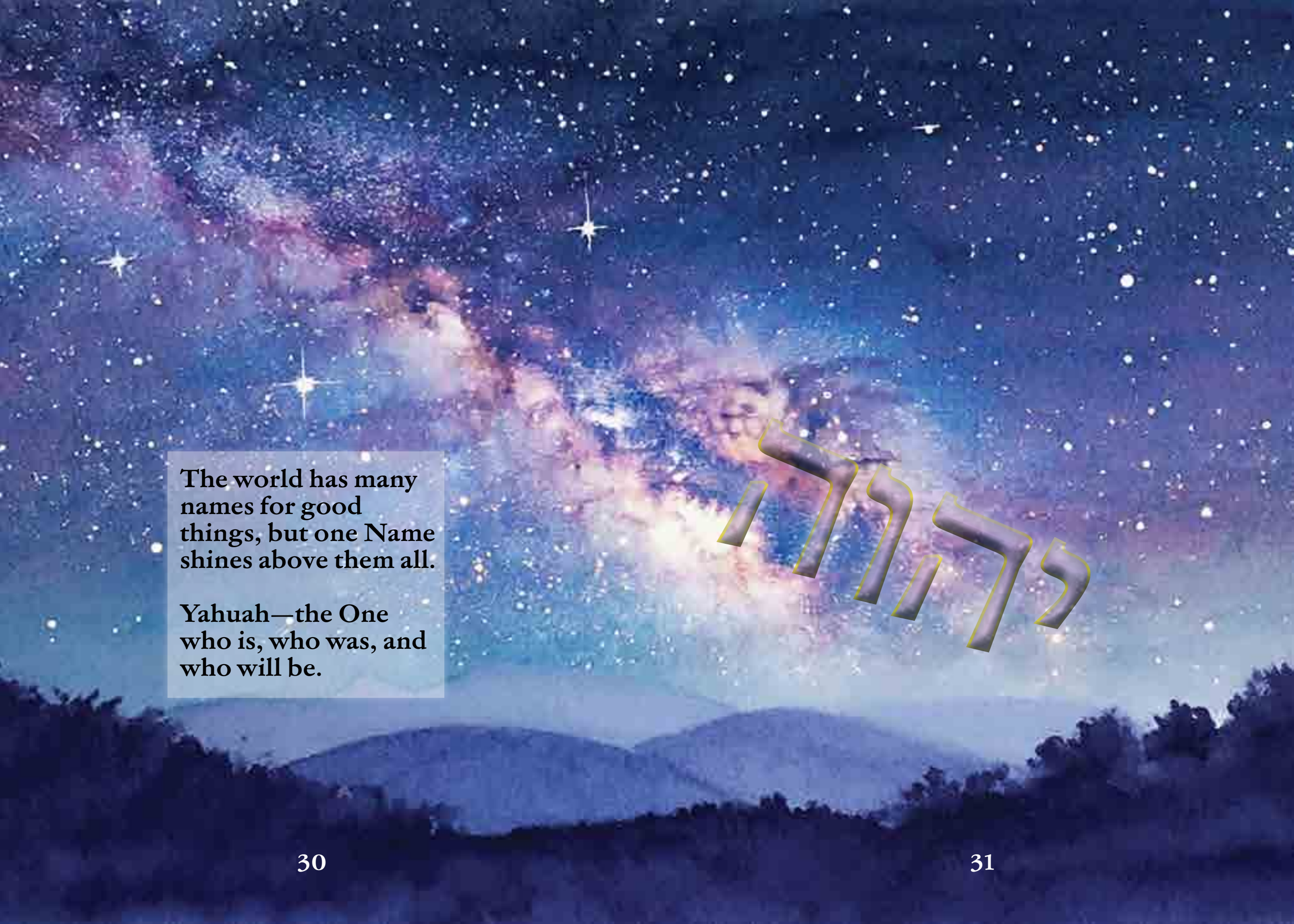
Grandpa joined her. “See the light, Eliora? His promises always come to pass.”

PARENT STUDY NOTES:

Since before the Dark Ages, a veil began to fall over the eyes of the church. Variations of replacement names for YHWH became common place even in our Bibles. However, The Name was called upon since early Genesis and it remains.

The Name Was Known Before Moses

Some argue the Name Yahuah (יהוה) was unknown prior to Moses, based on certain translations of Exodus 6:3. However, the Scriptures show that Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Lot, angels — and even Yahuah Himself — openly spoke and used the Name long before the Exodus.

Abraham and His Household Spoke the Name of Yahuah

Abraham personally called on the Name Yahuah (יהוה):

“...Abraham called on the Name of Yahuah.” – Genesis 13:4

“...and called there on the Name of Yahuah, the everlasting Elohim.” – Genesis 21:33

“And Abraham called the name of that place Yahuah Yireh... ‘In the mount of Yahuah...’” – Genesis 22:14

Yahuah spoke His own Name to Abraham:

“I am Yahuah that brought thee out of Ur...” – Genesis 15:7

“Is anything too hard for Yahuah?” – Genesis 18:13–14

“...shall keep the way of Yahuah... that Yahuah may bring upon Abraham...” – Genesis 18:19

Sarah used the Name Yahuah:

“Yahuah hath restrained me from bearing...” – Genesis 16:2

“...Yahuah judge between me and thee.” – Genesis 16:5

Hagar spoke and named Yahuah:

“Yahuah hath heard thy affliction.” – Genesis 16:11 (Angel of Yahuah)

“...she called the Name of Yahuah...” – Genesis 16:13

Abraham invoked the Name publicly:

“...Yahuah, the Most High Elohim...” – Genesis 14:22

Angels affirmed Yahuah before Lot:

“...before the face of Yahuah; and Yahuah hath sent us to destroy it.”

– Genesis 19:13

Lot repeated the Name:

“...for Yahuah will destroy this city.” – Genesis 19:14

What About Exodus 6:3?

Many translations render Exodus 6:3 as if the patriarchs did not know the Name YHWH, but this contradicts Genesis, where Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Lot, and even angels speak His Name frequently. Even Abraham’s servants spoke the name Yahuah at least 8 times in Genesis 24 and one can follow Isaac and Jacob continuing that practice. The Hebrew word לִּפְנֵי (lo’) can be rendered as “beforehand” or “from before,” fitting both context and Scripture. Therefore, a better rendering is: *‘...and by My Name YHWH I was made known to them beforehand.’* This affirms that Abraham and the patriarchs already knew His Name, consistent with their spoken testimony.

Test Every Doctrine (1 Thessalonians 5:21)

When a teaching contradicts numerous Scriptures...

we must re-evaluate it. “Test all things; hold fast to that which is good.”

Prophetic Restoration:

Abraham and his household knew, used, and declared the Name Yahuah — affirming that the sacred Name predates Moses.

יהוה (YHWH) is not a title—it is a Name. Titles like LORD (capitalized) and GOD replaced His true Name. He rejects that in Ezekiel 39:7 and Isaiah 52:6.

The Hebrew Scriptures (Tanakh) contain יהוה over 6,800 times, yet most English Bibles conceal it.

Scripture itself warns people would forget His Name (Jeremiah 23:27).

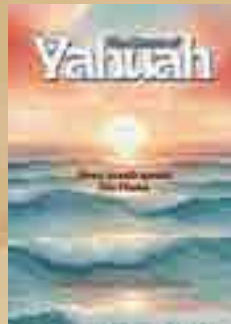
But prophecy also says His people would know His Name again (Isaiah 52:6, Ez. 39:7).

1 Kings 18:24 KJV: “And call ye on the name of your gods, and I will call on the name of the LORD [יהוה - YHWH]: and the God that answereth by fire, let him be God [Elohim].”

YHWH is preserved and defined in the name of EliYAHU. YAHU is Elohim. Many prophets and kings affirm this pronunciation.
