Foreword

From the Foundations Rising Team

We are living in a time when many are losing faith—not because truth has failed, but because it has been fractured, diluted, and buried under layers of tradition and translation. "So will I make my holy name known in the midst of my people Israel; and I will not let them pollute my holy name any more: and the heathen shall know that I am Yahuah, the Holy One in Israel." – Ezekiel 39:7 (KJV)

This restoration is not just academic. It is relational. It is worshipful. It is identity-forming. And... it is commanded in our age.

We did not create this movement.

We simply recognized that He is already awakening His people worldwide.

We have seen youth cry out with fire once they speak the Name in truth. We have seen elders weep upon hearing יהוה declared over them again. We have witnessed worship transform when His true Name returns to their lips. This book was born from that awakening.

It is not a textbook meant to argue—it is a journey meant to restore. It is not a weapon for division—it is a bridge for understanding for the Remnant. It is not about ego—it is about echoing His Name through generations.

It is a call back to covenant. A call back to inheritance. A call back to identity.

Alongside this study, we built an accompanying sound—a musical restoration we call Foundations Echo Collective. In the Hebrew manuscripts, the Father's Name - יהוה (YHWH) - appears over 6,800 times.

In nearly every modern Bible, it was replaced with titles such as LORD or GOD.

Why?

Fear. Tradition. Theology. Translation policies.

But never Scripture.

Yet prophecy declared a time when His Name would be restored among His people.

"Therefore My people shall know My Name..."

-Isaiah 52:6

"I make my holy name known... and I will not let them pollute my holy name any more... heathen shall know that I am Yahuah" — Ezekiel 39:7 (KJV)

How to Use This Study

A Guide for Groups, Families, Youth, and Personal Revival

This is not just a study book. It's a journey of restoration—of faith, identity, and worship. Whether you are a small group, a youth gathering, a family at home, or a single seeker hungry to know the Truth more deeply, this guide is built to meet you where you are... and lead you to His Name.

For Small Groups or Bible Fellowships (60–90 min/session)

- Open with prayer
- Read core Scriptures (out loud, rotating readers)
- Explore Hebrew names (יהודים, יהושע, יהוהי) as a group
- · Watch or listen to optional song segment
- · Discuss using provided reflection questions

- Close with a prayer using His Name (יהוה / Yahuah)

Optional: End each session with one song from the Foundations Echo Collective playlist.

Personal Study / Devotional Track

- Spend 15–20 minutes daily, revisiting core passages

- Pray the Name each morning (Ex. 3:15 as a declaration)

Week 1: The Eternal Name Revealed from the Beginning

Lesson Objectives

By the end of this session, participants should:

Recognize that the Father has a personal Name: יהוה (YHWH)

Understand that it appears ~6,800 times in the Hebrew Scriptures

See that it was replaced in English Bibles by LORD/GOD

Restored Reading

Learn that Hebrew is the original language of Creation (Book of Jubilees testimony)

Understand that vowel marks were added much later (Masoretic era), not original

Realize forgetting the Name was prophesied — and so was its restoration

The Language of Creation — Book of Jubilees Evidence

Jubilees 12:25–27 records that Hebrew (Ivri) was restored to Abram as the language of Creation, spoken by Adam, Enos, Noah, and Shem.

Hebrew existed before Babel and before Mesopotamian influence.

Abraham received it so he could read "the writings of his fathers."

The Holy Name first appears in Genesis 2:4, and men spoke it audibly from Genesis 4:26.

Thus, יהוה (YHWH) was never unknown or unpronounceable.

The Name Was Known Before Moses

Some argue that the Name Yahuah was unknown prior to Moses based on certain translations of Exodus 6:3, but Scripture shows otherwise. Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Lot, angels—and even Yahuah Himself—spoke and used the Name long before the Exodus.

Abraham and His Household Spoke the Name of Yahuah

Abraham called on Yahuah

- "...Abraham called on the Name of Yahuah." Genesis 13:4
- "...and called there on the Name of Yahuah, the everlasting Elohim."
- Genesis 21:33
- "And Abraham called the name of that place Yahuah Yireh..." Genesis 22:14

Yahuah spoke His own Name to Abraham

- "I am Yahuah that brought thee out of Ur..." Genesis 15:7
- "Is anything too hard for Yahuah?" Genesis 18:13–14
- "...shall keep the way of Yahuah..." Genesis 18:19

Sarah used the Name Yahuah

- "Yahuah hath restrained me from bearing..." Genesis 16:2
- "...Yahuah judge between me and thee." Genesis 16:5

Hagar spoke and named Yahuah

- "Yahuah hath heard thy affliction." Genesis 16:11
- "...she called the Name of Yahuah..." Genesis 16:13

Abraham invoked the Name publicly

- "... Yahuah, the Most High Elohim..." — Genesis 14:22

Angels and Lot affirmed Yahuah

- "...before the face of Yahuah; and Yahuah hath sent us to destroy it."
- Genesis 19:13
- "...for Yahuah will destroy this city." Genesis 19:14

What About Exodus 6:3?

Some English translations render it as if the patriarchs did not know the Name YHWH, but Genesis contradicts this. Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Lot, and even angels speak His Name freely. Even Abraham's servants use the Name multiple times (Genesis 24).

The Hebrew word לא (lo') can also mean "beforehand" or "from before." A better reading is:

"...and by My Name YHWH I was made known to them beforehand."

This fits context and affirms the patriarchs already knew His Name.

Test Every Doctrine – 1 Thessalonians 5:21

"Test all things; hold fast that which is good."
When a teaching contradicts numerous Scriptures, we must re-evaluate it.

Teaching Summary

יהוה (YHWH) is not a title but a Name.

Titles like LORD and GOD replaced His true Name—He rejects that (Ezekiel 39:7; Isaiah 52:6).

The Name appears 6,800+ times in the Tanakh but is concealed in most translations.

Scripture warned His people would forget His Name (Jeremiah 23:27) and promised its restoration (Isaiah 52:6).

Hebrew was the language of Creation—predating Greek—and did not require vowel points.

Masoretic scribes (6th–10th century AD) added vowel points; the Dead Sea Scrolls (300 B.C.–1st century A.D.) show the earlier text without them.

Therefore, the idea that the Name is "unknown because vowels are missing" is false.

Men spoke it from Genesis 4:26 and recorded it since Genesis 2:4.

We are now living in the time when יהוה (YHWH) is being restored to His people.

☞ Reflection Questions

How does it impact you to know the Father has a specific Name— יהוה (YHWH)?

Why do you think it was removed from most Bible translations?

If Hebrew was the original Creation language, what does that imply about its spiritual importance?

How does restoring His Name affect your relationship with Him?

Do you feel a responsibility to call upon His Name rather than a replacement title?

If Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Lot, and angels freely spoke His Name long before Moses, what does this reveal about the covenant's personal nature?

Does using His Name draw you into a deeper relationship—and how do you feel about speaking it today?

Prayer Focus

"Father יהוה, reveal to me the importance of Your Name. Remove confusion and awaken truth in my spirit. Help me honor You as You have revealed Yourself—not as man has redefined You."

™ Challenge for the Week

Write the Name יהוה (YHWH) somewhere visible as a reminder.


Practice speaking it reverently in prayer or praise (Yah-u-ah).

Week 2: The Name Hidden in Plain Sight: (YHWH) in the New Testament through Yahusha & the Prophets



Lesson Objectives

By the end of this session, participants will:

Understand that the Name יהוה (YHWH) was not absent in the New Testament, but it was embedded in names and praises.

See how Yahusha (יהושעי) literally carries the Father's Name.

Realize that many prophetic names retained Yahu/Yah endings through Greek translation.

See the unbreakable prophetic link: Father's Name \rightarrow Son's Name \rightarrow His Followers.

Recognize that Yahusha Himself said He declared the Father's Name.

Begin to understand the linguistic shift from -YAHU \rightarrow -IAS in Greek.

Confirm that Hallelu-Yah appears unchanged in Revelation.

SECTION 1 – The Name in the Son: יהושע (Yahusha)

Yahusha (יהושע) means "Yahuah is Salvation."

יהו (Yahu) = the short form of יהו (YHWH)

שע (sha) = "saves" or "delivers"

This reveals that the Father's Name יהוה is literally embedded within the Name of the Messiah.

Angels bear the suffix –EL (Gabriel, Michael), but the Son bears YAHU.

Matthew 1:21 ties His Name directly to the Hebrew root yasha ("to save").

This aligns with Exodus 23:21, where Yahuah says of the Messenger, "My Name is in Him."

SECTION 2 – Yahusha Declared the Name

In His final prayer before arrest, Yahusha twice affirmed:

"I have declared Your Name to them." — John 17:6, 26

If the Name were unknown or considered unpronounceable, He could not have declared it.

He did not substitute titles such as Lord or Adonai, but revealed and restored the true Name of the Father: Yahuah.

SECTION 3 – The Name Preserved in $-YAHU \rightarrow -IAS$ Greek Forms

Hebrew	Meaning	Greek NT Form	English
אַליהו (Eliyahu)	"My Elohim is Yahu"	Ήλίας (Elias)	Elijah

Even through Greek adaptation, the –Yahu ending survives as –ias, because it was originally spoken.

The Greek "I" carries a Yah sound, preserving the audible link to Yahuah.

• Linguistic proof that the Name was still known and spoken among early believers.

SECTION 4 – Hallelu-YAH Was Never Removed

- Revelation 19:1–6 preserves "Ἀλληλουϊά (Hallelu-Yah)" exactly as in Hebrew.
- \cdot This is irrefutable evidence that the short form YAH (יה) remained known and sung even in the Greek New Testament.

• If Hallelu-Yah is celebrated in Heaven, why would it ever be silenced on Earth?

SECTION 5 – Believers Are Called by the Name

- Ephesians 3:14–15: "The whole family in heaven and earth is named after the Father."
- True followers were called Yahudim meaning "Praise of Yah" (from יהודה).
- Angels bear "EL" (title-based) names; the Father's people bear YAHU (Namebased) identity.

Therefore: Yahusha's followers = Yahudim = Those belonging to Yahuah. The modern word "Jew" is not equivalent; it was never used in Scripture. Even if derived from Yahudah, the correct plural would read Yahudahim, not "Jews."

Group Discussion Questions

If Yahusha declared the Father's Name, why does today's church avoid it?

What does it mean that the Father's Name is embedded within Yahusha?

How does "Hallelu-Yah" in Revelation affect our understanding of His Name?

If the prophets, Messiah, and angels carried the Name, should we?

Does removing the Name affect our identity, authority, and intimacy with the Father?

Prayer Focus

"Father יהוה, thank You for placing Your Name in Your Son Yahusha. Restore Your Name in my heart and on my lips with reverence and truth. Let me walk in the identity of one who belongs to You."

™ Challenge for the Week

- Speak "Hallelu-Yah" with full understanding—Praise YAH.
- Begin using the Name Yahusha when speaking of the Savior.
- Memorize one prophetic name ending with -YAHU and its meaning.

Theme Song for This Week: "The Name of Yahuah."

Week 3: From יהוה (YHWH) to Κύριος (Kyrios):

The Greek Trail and the Silent Substitution

Lesson Objectives

By the end of this week, participants will:

Understand how the Name transitioned from Hebrew \rightarrow Greek \rightarrow Latin \rightarrow English

Recognize early Greek renderings: IAO (IAO), $I\alpha\beta\epsilon$ (Iabe), $I\alpha\omega$ (Iaho)

Meet ancient witnesses: Origen, Jerome, Theodoret, and other Church Fathers

See that the Name was first preserved, then substituted by tradition

Realize that the shift to Kyrios ("Lord") was intentional, not accidental

Grasp that this shift produced identity dilution and confusion—the "Pharisee leaven" Yahusha warned against

Be prepared for Week 4: Linguistic proof that -IAS endings preserve YAHU

Key Scriptures (Restored Form)

Restoring the Name restores clarity — who He is, who saves, and who we serve.

SECTION 1 - How the Name Was Handled in Early Greek Manuscripts

Original Use – Preserved, not removed.

Early Septuagint (LXX) copies such as Papyrus Fouad 266 kept יהוה (YHWH) in Hebrew letters inside Greek text.

They did not translate the Name but left it intact.

Stages of Transition

The divine identity thus moved from personal Name to generic title.

SECTION 3 – Why This Matters Theologically

Personal → Generic

יהוה (YHWH) is covenant-specific.

[&]quot;Lord" can refer to any master or god; in Hebrew, even Baal shares that rendering.

Identity Confusion

When "Lord" is applied to both the Father and the Son, distinct identities blur.

Exegetical Damage

When Paul and Luke quote Joel 2:32 ("call on YHWH") as "call on the Lord," readers lose awareness of which Name was meant.

Fulfillment of Prophecy

- Jeremiah 23:27: "They have caused My people to forget My Name..."
- The substitution directly fulfills that warning—an intentional obscuring, not an accident.

SECTION 4 – Why Some Hid the Name (and Why We Must Recover It) Reason They Hid It Why It Fails Biblically

- "Too holy to speak." Yahusha spoke and declared it (John 17:6, 26).
- "Avoid vain use." Exodus 20:7 forbids vain use, not any use.
- "Tradition of the elders." Yahusha rebuked such traditions (Matthew 15:9).
- "Fear of mispronunciation." Prophets called on the Name-faith over fear.



SECTION 1 - Hebrew Name Endings Containing Yahu / Yah

Eliyahu stands as the model showing how divine identity is preserved in personal names.

The elements YAH / YAHU are contracted and full forms of יהוה (YHWH) itself.

SECTION 2 - How These Became Greek in the New Testament

Core Truth

The Messiah's Name was never "Yeshua." Scripture itself shows that the Greek Ἰησοῦς (Iēsous) corresponds to Joshua son of Nun—in Hebrew, Yahusha (יהושעי).

- Scriptural Evidence Acts 7:45 (KJV)
- "Which also our fathers that came after brought in with Jesus (' $l\eta\sigma o\tilde{u}\varsigma$) into the possession of the Gentiles..."
- It was Joshua son of Nun who led Israel into the land (Joshua 1:1). Therefore: 'In σ o \tilde{u} s = Joshua = Yahusha.

Why Not "Yeshua"

- "Yeshua" is a later post-exilic Aramaic shortening that drops "Yahu."
- It obscures the prophetic meaning tied to YHWH / Yahuah.
- The form was popularized by Pharisaic tradition in the Second Temple era.
- In Talmudic literature, "Yeshua" is used mockingly, proving it is not a sacred preservation.
- Therefore: Yeshua ≠ Yahusha ≠ Jesus.

Only Yahusha / Yahushua maintains the Father's Name and meaning: "Yahuah is Salvation."

SECTION 3 – The -IAS Greek Endings Preserve Yahu (יהוו)

Greek grammar required Hebrew names ending in יהו (Yahu) or יהו (Yah) to adapt into -IA Σ (-ias) or -AIO Σ (-aios) forms, preserving the original vocal sound.

Even within Greek transliteration, the sound of "Yahu" survives in -ias / -aios. Later translators dropped the meaning and replaced these with Anglicized forms stripped of the divine element.

Before the English "Judah" or "Jews" existed, Scripture identified a covenant people whose name carried Yahu, the shortened form of YHWH.

• "Yahudim" is not the plural of Yahudah; the grammatical plural would be Yahudahim (יהודהים).

Rather, Yahudim describes a people defined by their relationship to Yahu—not by tribe or geography.

SECTION 1 – Covenant Identity Was in YAHU, Not Tribalism

Originally, the people called Yahudim were identified by the Name they bore and praised.

Their covenant was theocentric (rooted in Yahuah), not ethnocentric.

Gentiles could join them by allegiance to Yahuah's covenant.

Later English translators replaced Yahudim with "Jews," a foreign term lacking any link to Yahu.

This linguistic shift erased the Name from the identity of His people.

SECTION 2 – Scriptural Echo: People Called by His Name

"And You have declared that Your Name is called upon this house." -2 Chron 7:14 "All people of the earth shall see that you are called by the Name of YHWH." - Deut 28:10

His people are named by His Name - Yahu.

Covenant identity is spiritual, rooted in relationship, not lineage.

Paul's Restoration:

"He is a Yahudi who is one inwardly..." — Romans 2:29

Paul reinstates the true Yahudi identity—those inwardly aligned with Yahu, regardless of bloodline.

SECTION 3 - End-Times Prophecy: True vs False Yahudim

The Covenant Identity

Week 6: Yahusha vs. Jesus: Salvation is of Yahu

Recognize that "Jesus" is a later Greek-Latin construct lacking the Hebrew meaning.

See scriptural proof that salvation is tied to the Name of the Father.

Realize prophetic fulfillment requires the form "Yahu-sha."

Begin transitioning prayer, worship, and identity back to the true Name.

Combined → Yahu + sha = Yahusha (יהושעי) = "Yahu is Salvation."

This fulfills both linguistic and prophetic precision.

Scriptural Proof — Acts 7:45

It refers to Joshua son of Nun-the Hebrew Yahusha.

Therefore: $\ln \sigma \circ \tilde{U} \subseteq Joshua = Yahusha$.

There is no scriptural equation linking "Yeshua" to Jesus.

• Conclusion:

Jesus = Joshua = Yahusha (יהושעי) — "Yahu is Salvation."

"Yeshua" = a later supposed abbreviation (same syllables) that erased the Name.

SECTION 3 – Why "Jesus" Lacks the Hebraic Meaning

Greek limitations caused critical losses:

There is no equation of Yeshua as Jesus in any scripture — only Joshua, whose Hebrew form is Yahusha.



Yahusha declared the Father's Name so His people could know Him, not merely know about Him.

When we call on Abba Yahuah, we are no longer servants repeating tradition — we are children calling home.

"Abba Yahuah, we return to You as Your children.

Restore the warmth of Your presence and the reverence of Your Name in our hearts.

Make our nation a light that calls others back to You − the one true Father."

- Transition into a chorus: "Abba Yahuah, we return."
- End with group declaration:
- "From the Isles of the East, we call Your Name again Abba Yahuah, receive our praise."

Philippines Reflection (for study leaders to read aloud)

"In these islands, the Father is restoring what was forgotten.

His Name, His covenant, His presence.

The sound of Yahuah will once again rise from the shores of Ophir — not as rebellion, but as reconciliation.

For this is the hour of the return — from Abba to Yah."


